## **Financial Assistance**

The purpose of the International Financial Aid Form is to help Dordt University obtain standardized, complete and accurate information about the funds available to international students who want to study here. When this form is completed an applicant, who has been admitted to Dordt University, may obtain authorization and issuance of a Certificate of Eligibility (Form I-20) from the university.

Assistance for international students may include academic and activity scholarships, International Student Tuition Grant (ISTG)\*\*, and the Dordt University Student Employment Program. (For more information on these programs, see the Financial Aid and Scholarships brochure.) There may be some private/alternative loan programs available to international students, if the student has a creditworthy U.S. co-signer.

The Student Employment Program provides an opportunity for international students to earn spending money during the school year. Wages begin at \$9.00/hour and increase based on number of hours worked at a previous position. Total earnings depend on the number of hours the student is able to work. This should be completed and returned by **June 1**, **2024** in order to be considered in the first round of placement.

Remember, these figures are for 2023-2024. They may be slightly higher for the 2024-2025 school year.

Charges for each semester (tuition, fees, room, and board) are due at the beginning of the semester. Students who do not make full payments will be subject to a finance charge of .75% per month (9% annually) on the unpaid balance. This amount must be paid prior to registration for the next academic semester before transcripts can be released.

In addition, the student must consider indirect costs. These expenses include books, travel and personal spending, and are very different from student to student.

This form should be filled out and sent in <u>after</u> **October 1, 2023**, **but before April 1, 2024**. Applications received late will be considered, but funds are more limited for late applicants.

\*\*Please note that the ISTG may be reduced for a student who chooses to live off campus.
