### First Destination Report

The Dordt University Career Development Center follows the standards and protocols specified by NACE (National Association for Colleges and Employers) when gathering first-destination data. As part of these standards, the Career Development Center collected data through a first-destination survey that was distributed five times to the class of 2021. In addition to information gathered from the survey, data was also collected from reliable sources such as fellow graduates, parents, faculty members, commencer cards, and LinkedIn profiles. As indicated in NACE's Standards and Protocols, the Career Development Center made "good faith efforts to verify the information obtained by any source other than the graduate or in any case where there is some concern about the accuracy of the available information." The data collection concluded on December 31, 2021.

#### **Explanation of Terms**

- Career Outcome: graduates who are employed or continuing education
- Knowledge Rate: percentage of graduates for whom career outcome information is known
- Employed: graduates who are employed full-time, part-time, self-employed, interning or in temporary positions.

#### Where are they now...

Graduates of the Class of 2021 have settled in 27 states, 4 foreign countries, including 3 Canadian provinces.
