

# Canadian Financial Aid Form Instructions

## Follow these important guidelines:

1. Use a pen with dark ink.
2. **Print** legibly.
3. Report all amounts in Canadian dollars; round off to the nearest dollar.
4. **When the instructions direct you to skip questions, you may leave them blank. In all other cases, even if a question does not apply, do not leave it blank. Fill in the space with a zero instead.**
5. Complete your tax return before filling out this financial aid form. The line references quoted are from the 2017 T1 General tax return. If your return is not completed at this time, estimate as accurately as possible. We may also request a copy of your return at a later date to verify certain information.
6. Use Section H to explain any special circumstances.
7. All amounts/conditions listed should apply as of the date the form is completed.
8. Be sure to complete the entire form. If any part is incomplete, we will return it to you for the missing information before processing it.
9. Make a photocopy of the completed form for your records.
10. SIGN AND DATE THE FORM WHEN COMPLETED and return as instructed at the end of the form.

## Financial Assistance

Assistance for Canadian students includes academic and activity scholarships, the Institutional Grant, Distance Grant, Alumni Grant, Century Need-Based Scholarship, Heritage 21 Grant, Heritage 21 Loan, Canadian Grant Program, and the Dordt College Student Employment Program. The Canadian Grant Program is offered by Dordt College to assist Canadian students by providing an allowance based on information provided in this form and the current exchange rate.

The Student Employment Program provides an opportunity for Canadian students to earn spending money during the school year. Total earnings depend on the number of hours the student is able to work. An application for employment is found online at [dordt.edu/student-employment-application](http://dordt.edu/student-employment-application). This should be completed and returned by **June 1, 2019** in order to be included in the first round of placement.

All students should contact their provincial government for information on Canadian loans and grants. A list of the departments to contact can be found on the reverse side of this page.

## Costs

For the 2018-2019 school year, costs are:

Remember, these figures are for 2018-2019. They may be slightly higher for the 2019-2020 school year.

Charges for each semester (tuition, fees, room, and board) are due at the beginning of the semester. Those who do not make full payments will be subject to a finance charge of .75% per month (9% annually) on the unpaid balance. This amount must be paid before transcripts can be released and prior to registration for the next academic semester.

In addition, the student must consider indirect costs. These expenses include books, travel and personal spending, and vary greatly from student to student.

This form should be filled out and sent in after **October 1, 2018, but before April 1, 2019**. Applications received late will be considered, but funds are more limited for late applicants.
