## Undergraduate Graduation Rate Summary

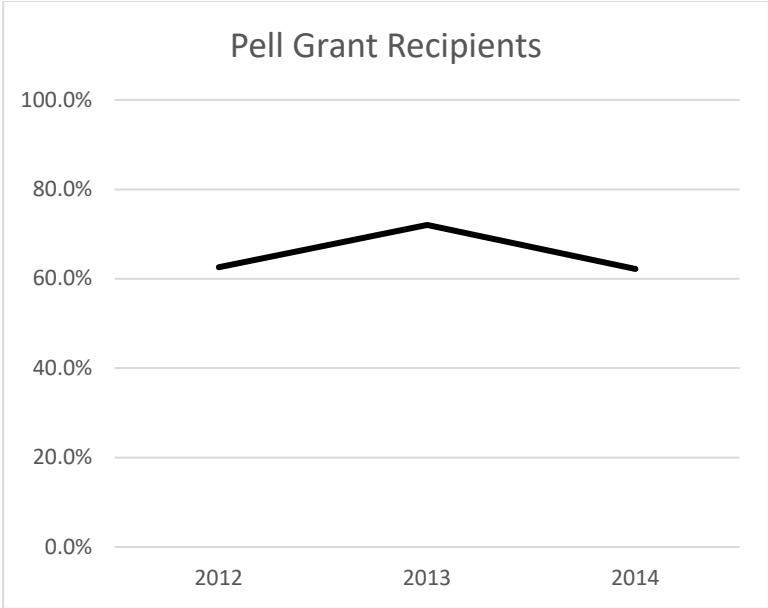
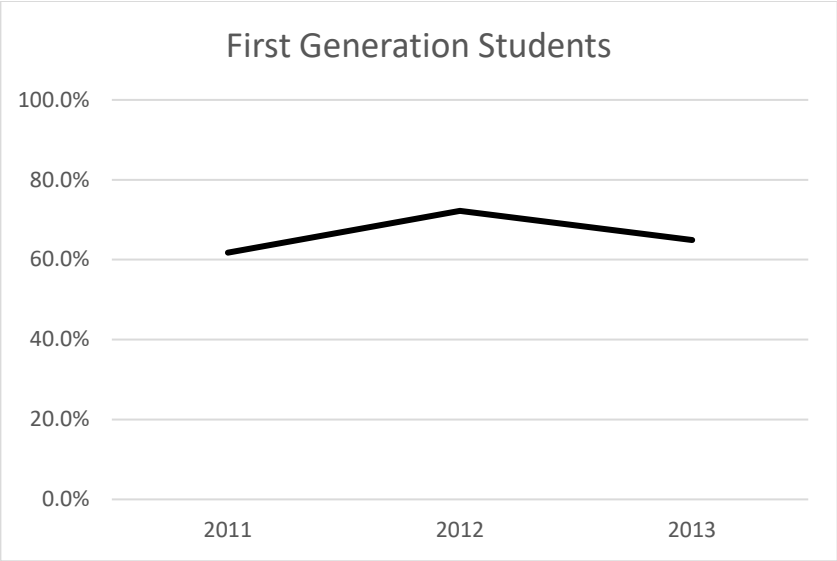
The A.A. rate reflects the number of students who entered an associate's degree program three years prior to the reporting year and successfully completed their degree by September 1st of that year. For example, the 2017 rate of 75.0% is based on the fact that 4 students entered Dordt in 2014 intending to pursue an associate's degree. Of those 4 students, 3 completed their degree by September 1, 2017. The B.A. rate reflects the number of students who entered a bachelor's degree program six years prior to the reporting year and successfully completed their degree by September 1st of that year.



The following charts show the graduation rate for recipients of co-curricular activity grants. Dordt College provides activity grants for athletics, music, student publication and theater arts. The graduation rates indicate the percentage of students that graduated based on their first year at Dordt as a first time, full time, degree seeking, freshman. For example, of the 156 student athletes entering Dordt in the fall of 2011, 97 have since graduated, producing a graduation rate of 62.2 percent. Graduation rates are provided for students identified as First Generation and for students who received Pell Grants. These charts indicate the percentage of graduates based on their enrollment year. Data for academic years after 2013 are not shown, as these indicate current students that have yet to graduate.

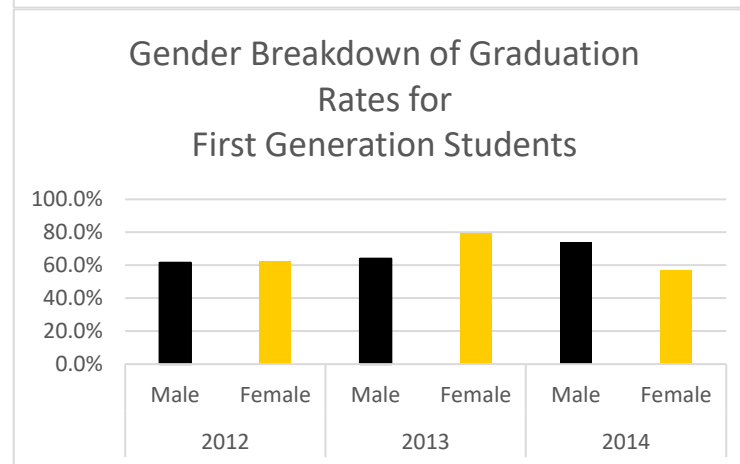
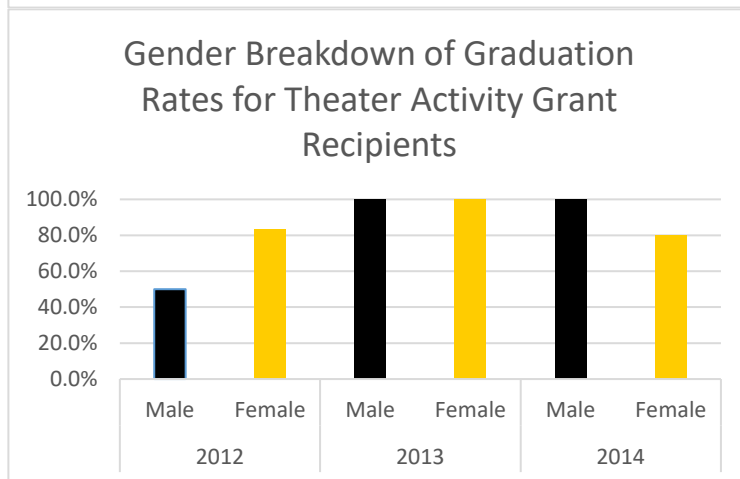
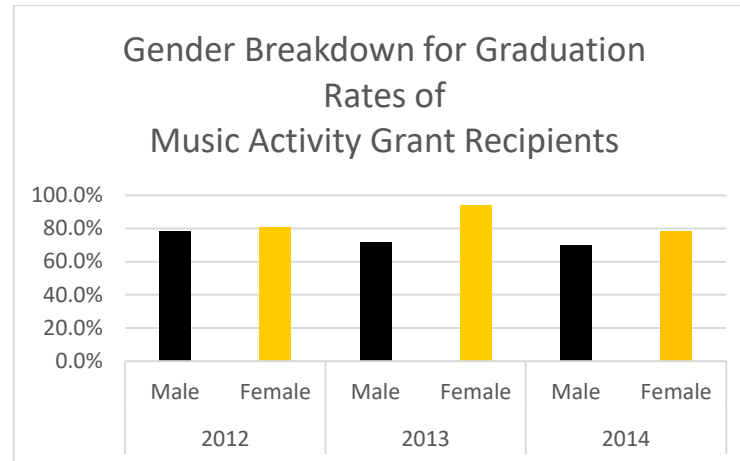
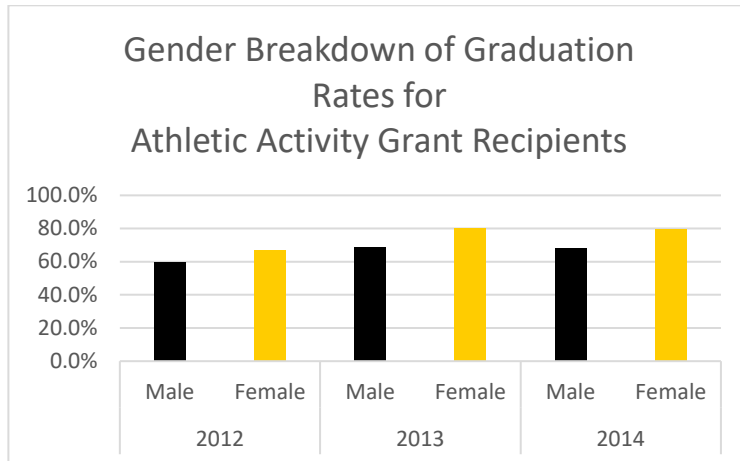

## Undergraduate Graduation Rate for Recipients of Co-Curricular Activity Grants by Gender

These charts show the graduation rate for recipients of co-curricular activity grants. Dordt College provides activity grants for athletics, music, student publication and theater arts. Graduation rates by gender are provided for students identified as First Generation and for students who received Pell Grants. The graduation rates indicate the percentage of students that graduated based on their first year at Dordt as a first time, full time, degree seeking, freshman. Academic years 2014 to present are not indicated on the charts, as these years represent current students.
