



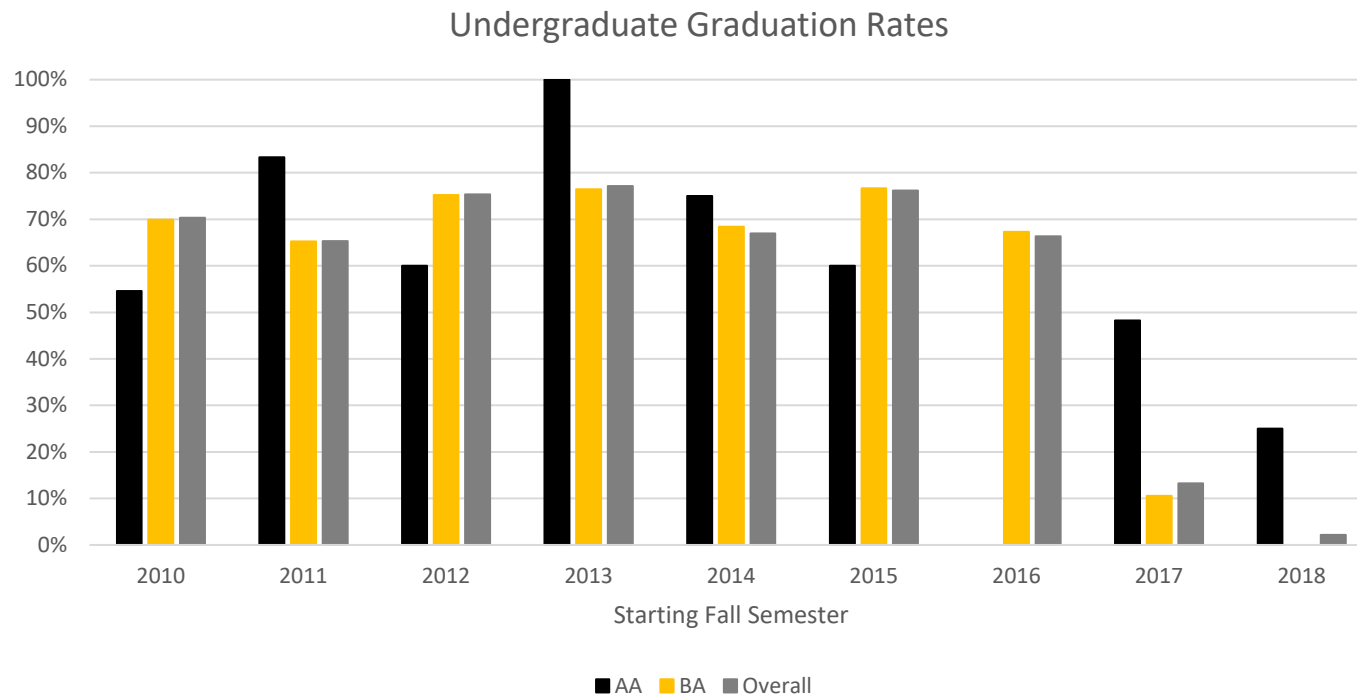

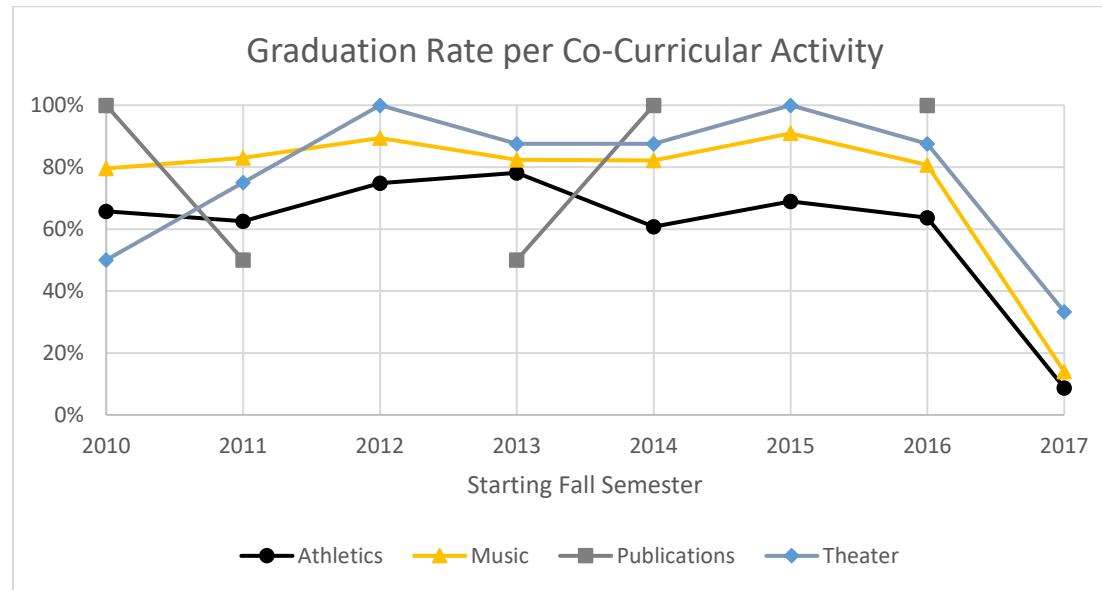

Undergraduate Graduation Rate Summary

The A.A. rate reflects the number of students who entered an associate degree program three years before the reporting year and completed their degree by September 1st of that year. For example, the 2014 rate of 75.0% shows that four students entered Dordt intending to pursue an associate degree. Of those four students, three completed their degree by September 1, 2017. The B.A. rate reflects the number of students who entered a bachelor's degree program six years before the reporting year and completed their degree by September 1st of that year. Students entering Dordt in 2018 and pursuing a B.A. degree have an expected 6-year graduation date of 2024.

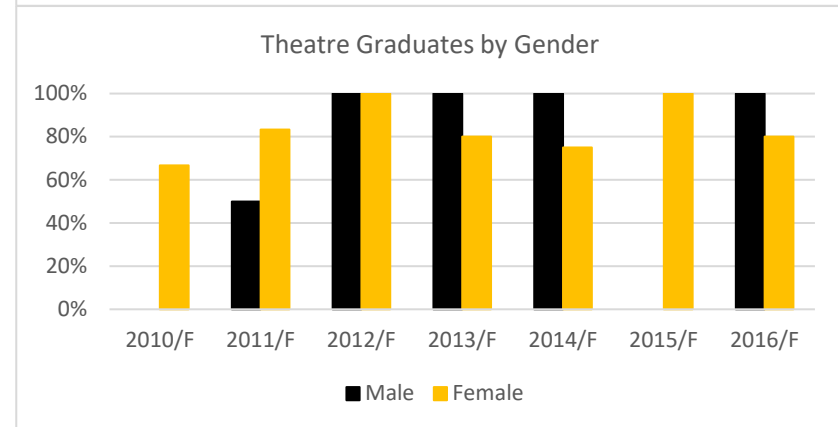
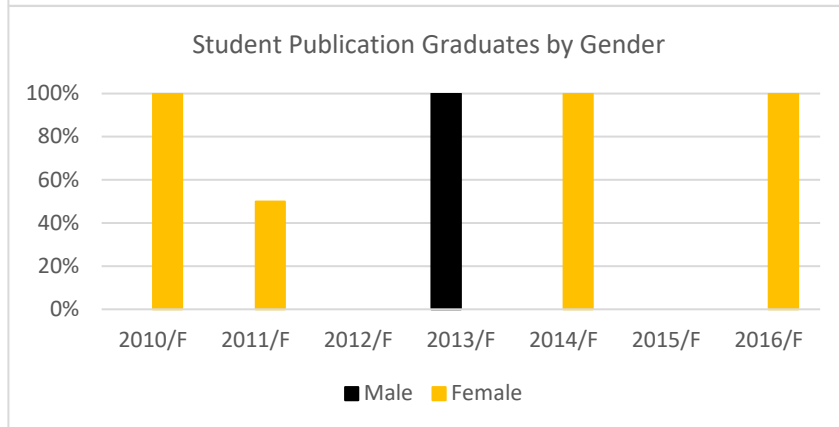
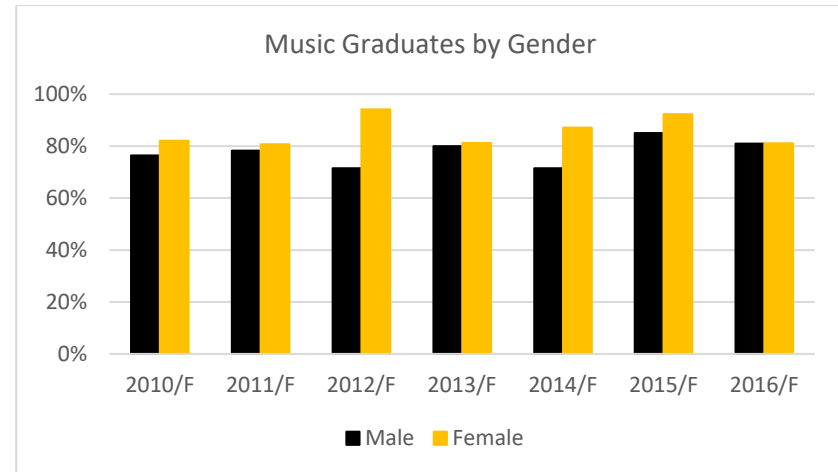
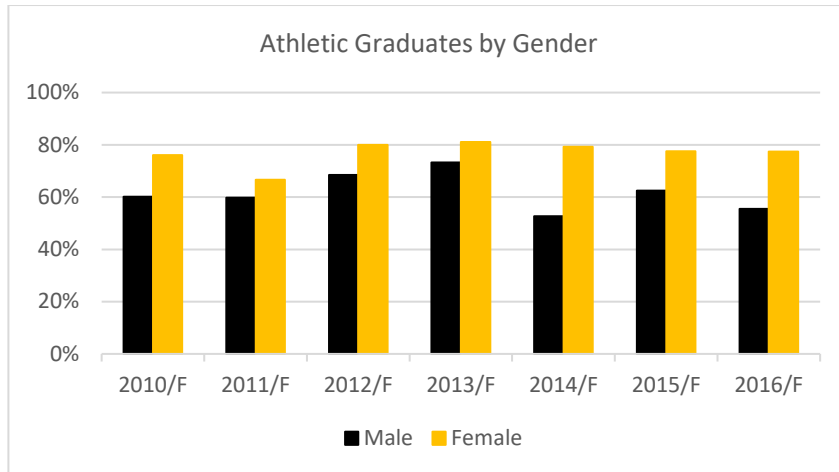


The following charts show the graduation rate for recipients of co-curricular activity grants. Dordt University awards activity grants for athletics, music, student publication and theater arts. The graduation rate indicates the percentage of students that graduated based on their first year at Dordt as a first time, full time, degree seeking, freshman. Activity Grants for student publications were not awarded in 2012 or 2015. Fall 2014 is the most recent year to report the 6-year graduation rate. Rates for students who started in the fall of 2015 or after reflecting the four-year rate and other early graduation times.

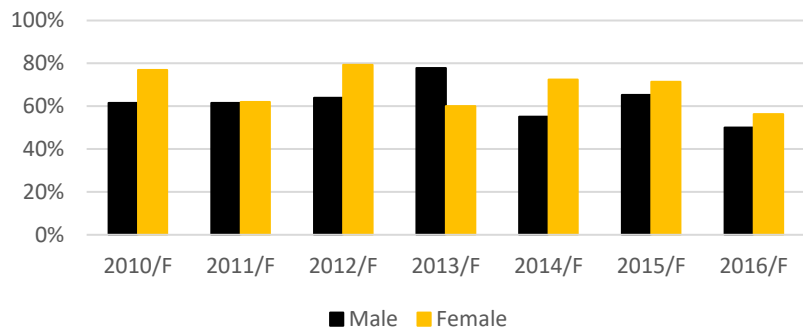


Undergraduate Graduation Rate for Recipients of Co-Curricular Activity Grants by Gender

These charts show the graduation rate for recipients of co-curricular activity grants. Dordt University provides activity grants for athletics, music, student publication and theater arts. Graduation rates by gender are broken down by fender for students identified as First Generation and for students who received Pell Grants The graduation rates indicate the percentage of students that graduated based on their first year at Dordt as a first time, full time, degree seeking, freshman. Activity grants are awarded for several reason, and are not distributed equally among genders. There are years where an activity grant may not be awarded to any male students, female students, or to any students at all.
