



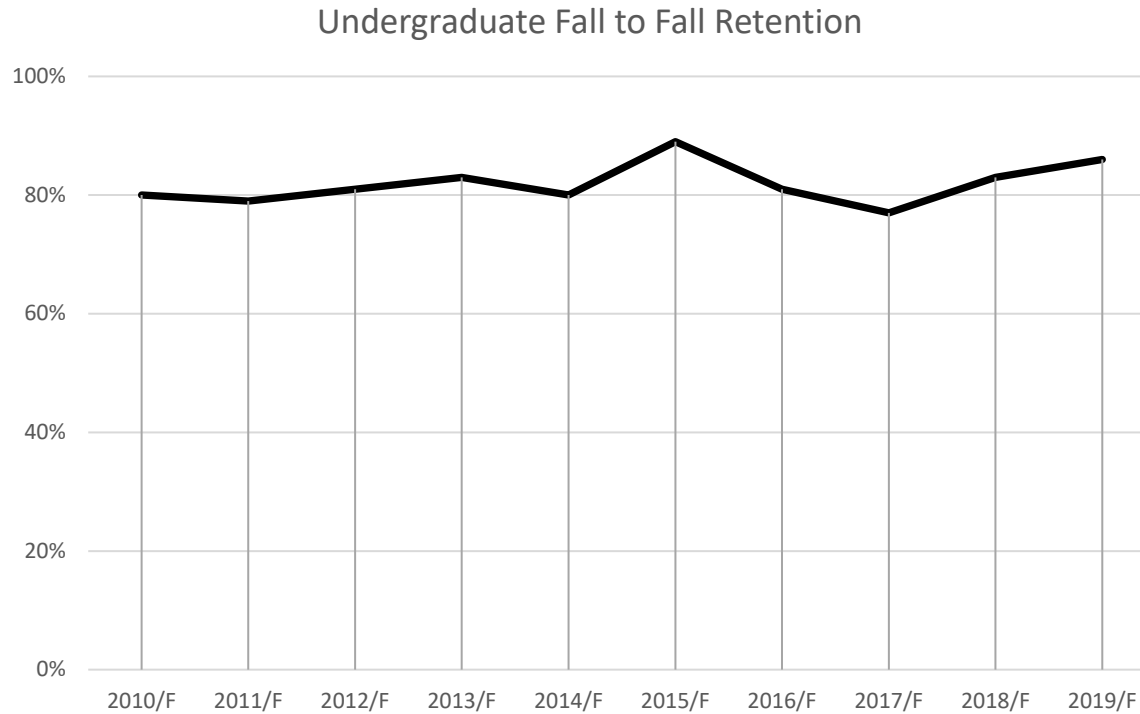

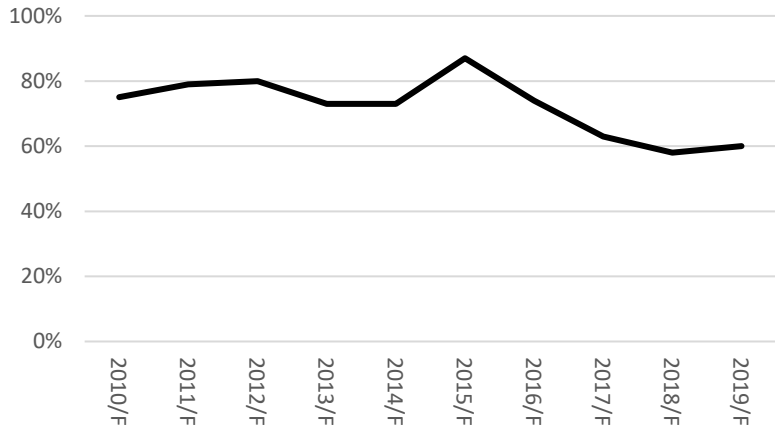

## Undergraduate Retention Summary

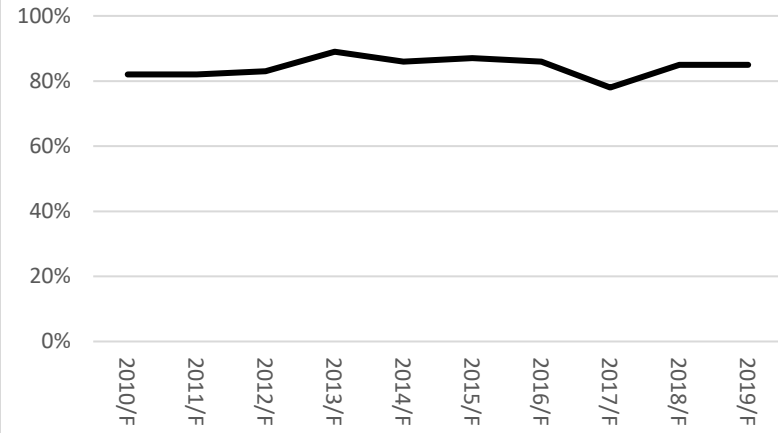
Undergraduate retention is based on the Fall to Fall or Freshmen to Sophomore rate. The percentage of students returning reflect the number of first time, full time, degree seeking freshmen from the prior year who returned in the fall of the reporting year. For example, the 2016 rate of 80.9% is based on the fact that of the 388 first time, full time freshmen in 2016, 314 returned in the fall of 2017. Retention rates for First Generation Students and Pell Grant recipients are also provided.



### Retention of First Generation Students

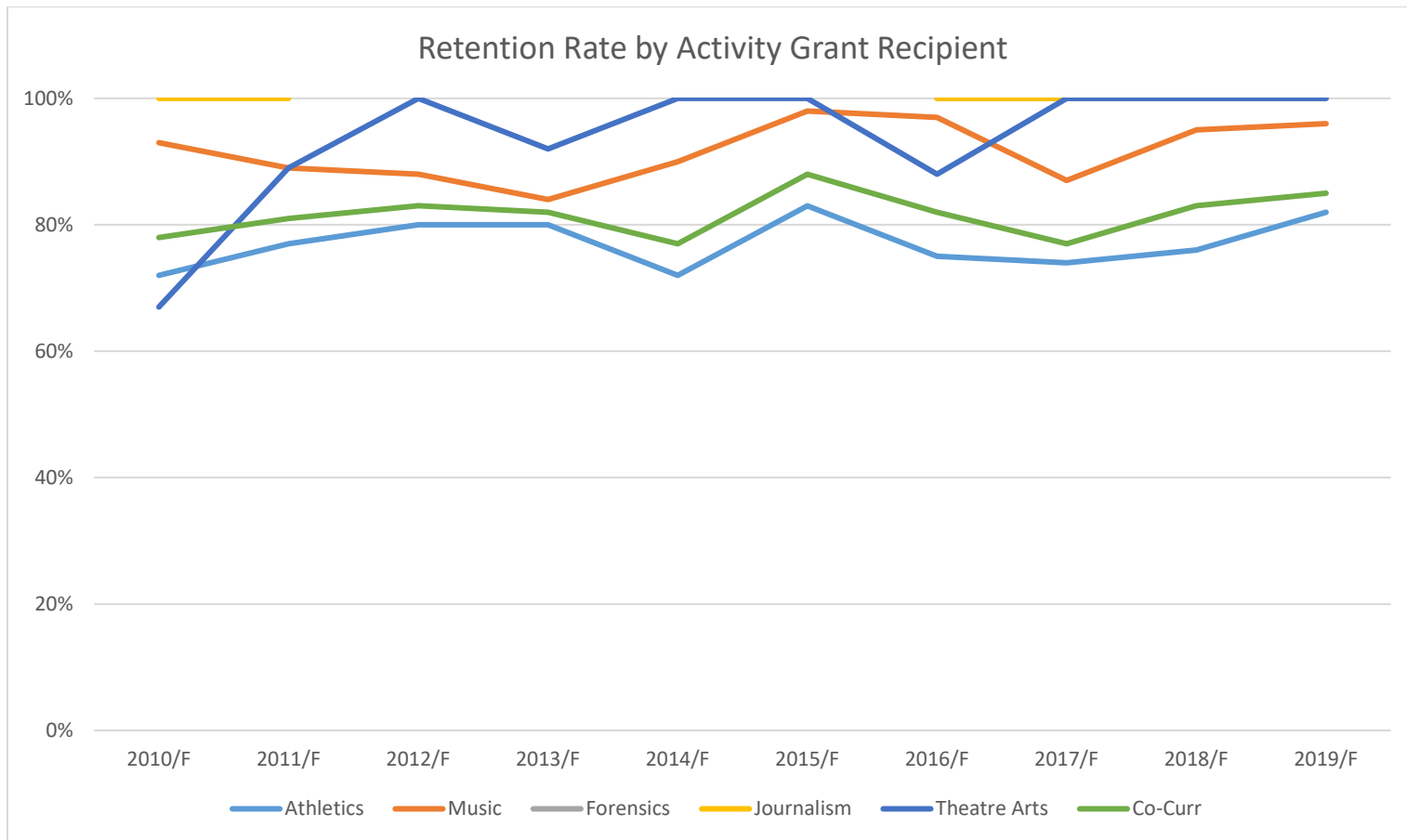


### Retention of Pell Grant Recipients



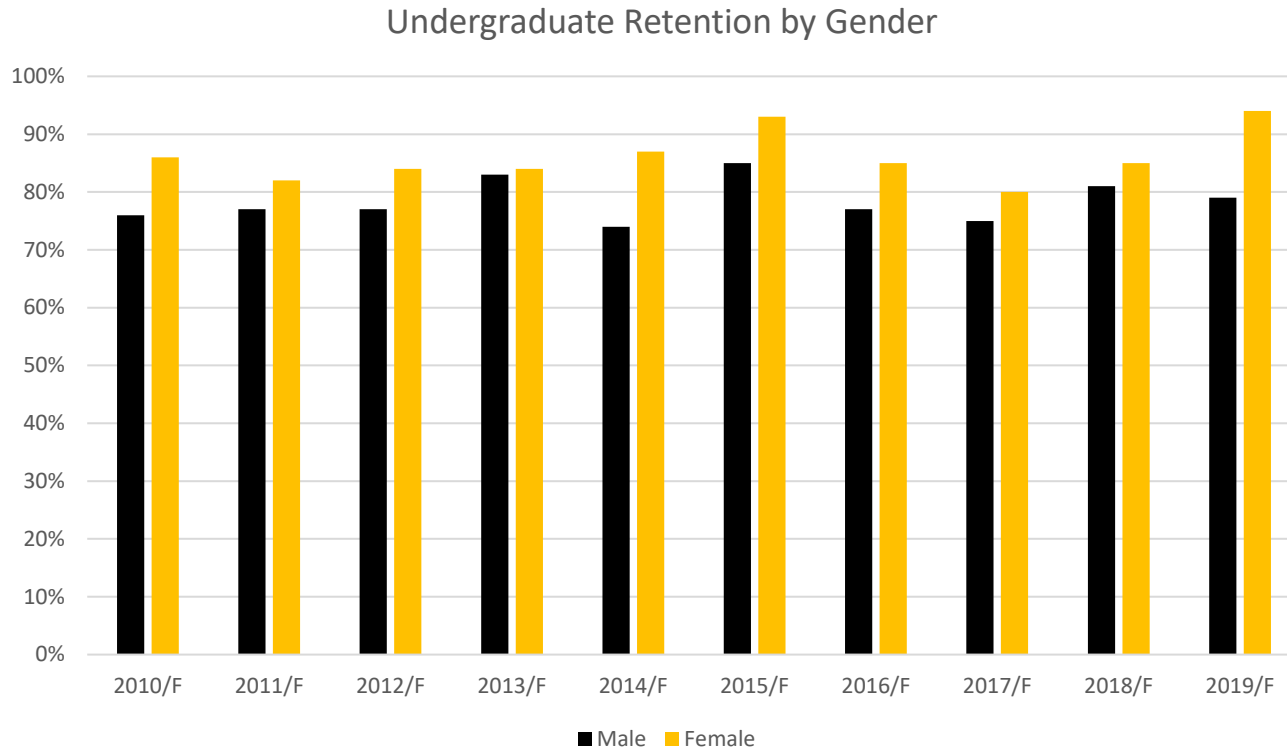
## Undergraduate Retention of Co-Curricular Activity Grant Recipients

Undergraduate retention of activity grants is based on FR-to-SO retention rate of students. These percentages reflect the number of first time, full time, degree seeking, freshman who received an activity grant. Dordt awards activity grants for athletics, music, student publications, and theater arts.

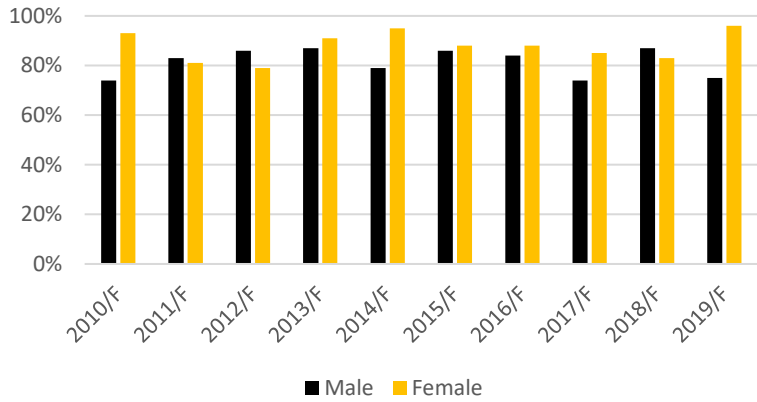


# Undergraduate Retention by Gender

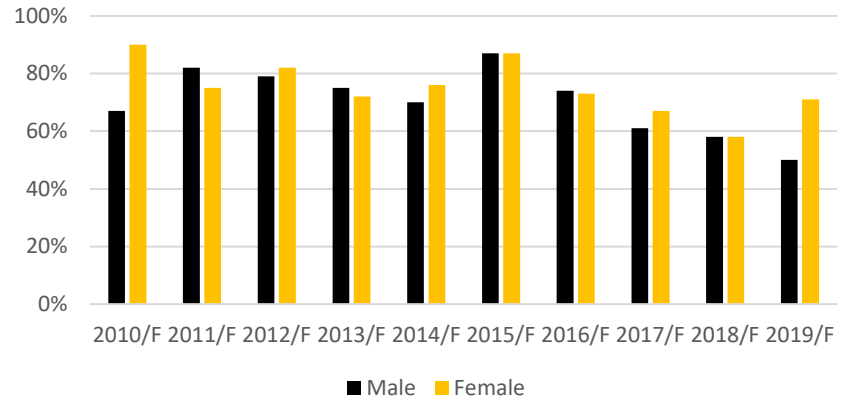

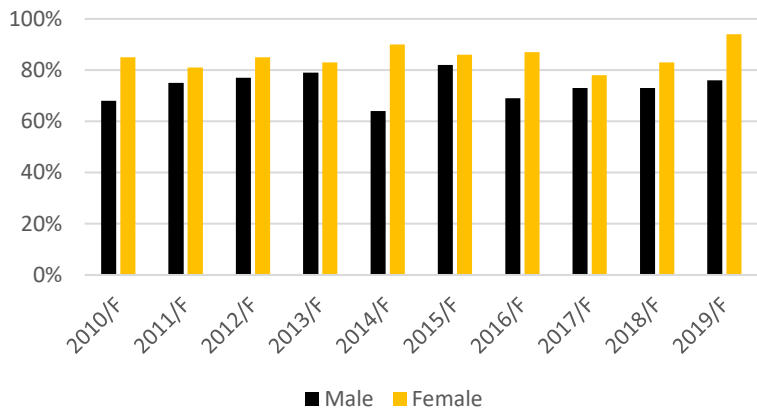
### Pell Grant Retention by Gender



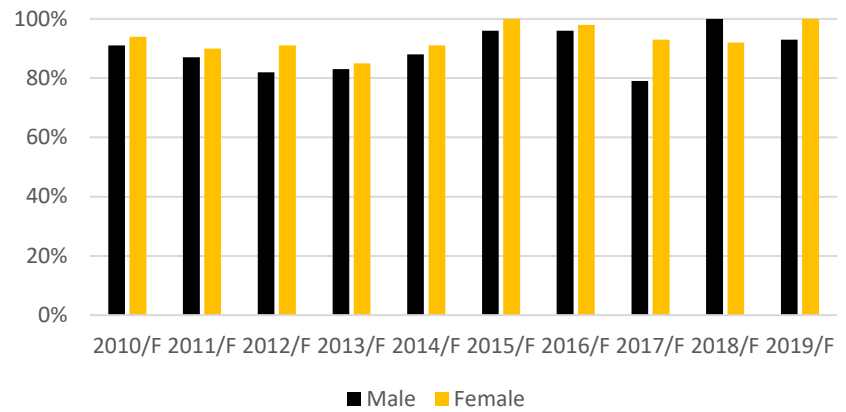
### First Generation Retention by Gender



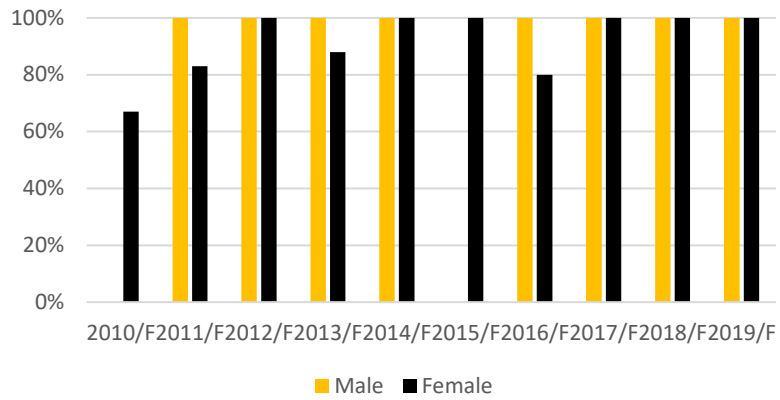
### Athletic Retention by Gender



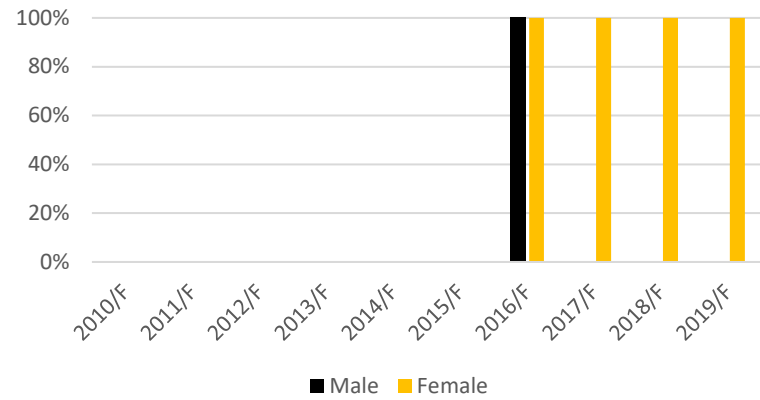
### Music Retention by Gender
